Lawsuit Against Healthcare Price-Fixing Law

Dr. Daniel Haller, an acute care surgeon, is suing the federal government. He says Congress should not be able to dictate the price he charges patients. Because he refuses to sign insurance contracts, his patients are out of network. The “No Surprise Bills” Act forces him into arbitration with the health plans that he’s refused to contract with, the health plans that pay lowball prices, the health plans that pushed Congress to pass this bill in 2020 so that they could limit what they pay every doctor in and outside of contracts.

There are no surprise bills. Everyone knows a bill is coming. The only surprise is that the corporate health plan you pay thousands to each year restricts your choices and then makes you pay extra. Our organization opposed the “No Surprise Bills” Act as another installment of socialized medicine.
