Three Numbers to Know about COVID-19!

Grab a pen and write down three numbers. Are you ready?

A new study finds the chance of an infected person without symptoms infecting a close contact is **3.5 percent**. The chance of an infected person with symptoms infecting a close contact is **12.8 percent**. A close contact is not a stranger; it's family or friends at prolonged social events.

The chance of getting COVID-19 from an infected household member is only **21.1 percent**. So, there's 79% chance you won't get infected from someone you live with. Share this good news with others who are scared to death of every unmasked person they meet.
