Excess Deaths Accelerated in 2023

In early 2022, a life insurance executive reported a 40% increase in excess deaths in people of working age. According to Edward Dowd, a former manager at Blackrock, from March 2021 to February of 2022, there was an 84% increase in deaths of millennials, ages 25 - 44. He says those 61,000 excess deaths, are about the same as the number who died during the 10-year Vietnam war.

Now, according to Mr. Dowd, the Society of Actuaries expects a 32 percent increase in excess deaths of working millennials during quarter three of 2023. In quarter one, there was only a 12 percent increase. These deaths are accelerating. Why?
