Protect Your Baby's DNA

State governments do genetic tests on babies without parental consent. Blood from the newborn's heel is squeezed onto a special filter paper. A state public health laboratory analyzes it for newborn genetic conditions, and in some cases, genetic conditions that present later in life. This is called newborn screening.

Newborn screening is the nation's largest genetic testing program. The results are recorded in a government record and the baby's medical record. Some states store the baby's DNA forever. Most parents do not know this test is being done but some states allow parents to opt out. No one can do a genetic test on you without your consent.
